



PETTAUGH ROLL OF HONOUR



Lionel William Frederick Creasey (Private; Suffolk Regiment). Died on 19th April 1918, aged 18. Chocques Memorial. (1901 census lists his father, Lionel {age 40}, as living at the Old Workhouse with his wife Ada {age 30} and children Samuel {5}, Lionel W {4}, Alice {3}, Frederick {2} and Ada {9 months}.) His sacrifice is also recorded on a plaque in the Framsdon Baptist Chapel.

Walter George Cutting (Trooper; Queen's Own Royal West Kent Regiment). Died on 26th October 1916, aged 33. Thiepval Memorial. (1891 census shows him as being the son of George and Katherine Cutting who lived at The Grove, now known as Moat Grove Farm.)

Herbert Louis Marshall (Gunner; Royal Field Artillery). Died on 17th August 1915 in Gallipoli, aged 25. Lancashire Landing Cemetery. The 1891 and 1901 census records show him as being the eldest son of Arthur and Mary Marshall who lived at Step House, Debenham Road; a memorial to Herbert is on the gravestone of his parent's grave. Arthur was a horseman on a farm and died in 1940, while his wife predeceased Herbert, dying in April 1915.

John (Jack) Read Moore (Guardsmen; Coldstream Guards). Died 16th October 1915, aged 22. Le Treport Cemetery. (Son of Rose Mary Self and husband of Gertrude Moore.)

Joseph Henry Self (Lance Corporal; Coldstream Guards). Died 27th March 1918, aged 20. Souchez Cemetery. (Son of William and Rose Mary Self, Laffitt's Hall.)

George Wells (Private; Suffolk Regiment). Died 3rd July 1916, age 37. Thiepval Memorial. (His wife was Ellen May, nee Wilby, and they had three children, Arthur, Harold and Hilda. Ellen May was the half-sister of William Wilby, see next entry.)

William John Wilby (Private; Royal Fusiliers). Died on 27th September 1917, aged 19. Tyne Cot Cemetery. (Son of Ernest and Ellen Wilby of Glebe Cottage; Ernest was the sexton.)

Phillip Hermond Peck (Cambridgeshire Regiment). Died in prisoner of war camp, Siam, between 1st July and 21st August 1943, aged 20, while working on the railway line featured in the film, "Bridge over the River Kwai". Kanchanaburi War Cemetery. (Son of Samuel and Minnie Peck.)

Frederick Charles Maskell (Royal Air Force). Died 15th August 1944, aged 44, in Woodbridge, Suffolk. St Catherine's Church. (Son of Charles and Susan Maskell.)
